His talk will feature scenes from famous film adaptations, as well as clips from more recent productions.

He is also director of artistic programs and dramaturgy at the American Repertory Theater, where he has served as lead dramaturge on more than 30 productions of plays, operas and musicals, over half of which were world premieres.
